Last week, the board of regents announced that Dr. Garnett Stokes will begin leading the University on March 1, 2018, as UNM's 22nd president. In my discussions with the incoming president, I found her forthcoming, well informed, and ready to take on the responsibility of leading UNM. I look forward to handing her the reins on that date, and going back to the provost role.

Since January 2017, when I was asked to be acting president, I have focused my efforts and messaging on the areas of campus climate, financial challenges, and our continuing efforts on advancing student success. I have since started the conversation about re-engineering the university, an effort I hope to continue throughout my tenure as interim president and then as provost. It continues to be my greatest privilege and honor to serve UNM, a university I joined in 1988, and I look forward to passing the mantle to President Stokes and to continue working with all of you.

New Federal Tax Proposals

The Association of Public & Land Grant Universities (APLU) monitors legislation that may affect universities such as ours. They have sent a [letter](#) to the House Ways and Means Committee, regarding H.R. 1, the Tax Cuts and the Jobs Act, expressing APLU's concerns about proposed changes to the tax code. These changes will affect student loans, research, and private giving.
