### Not Just Doing Well, But Also Doing Good

The strength of our institution is not only measured by the advancements made by our students, staff and faculty, but also by the achievements of our alumni who have accomplished so much built upon the knowledge and perspectives that they acquired during their time at UNM. At the [UNM Alumni Association's Winter Award Dinner](#) this past Thursday, we celebrated four distinguished individuals whom we recognized for their contributions to UNM and to society, and who have inspired others to apply their insight and creativity to their studies, their careers and their lives.

- **Gerald "Jerry" McNerney** ('73 BS, '75 MS, '81 Ph.D.) – James F. Zimmerman Award presented for this California Congressman's leadership in renewable energy government policy.
- **James Anaya** ('80 BA) – Bernard S. Rodey Award presented for championing the rights of indigenous people around the globe, for which he has also recently been nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize.
- **Breda Murphy Bova** ('79 Ph.D.) – Erna S. Fergusson Award presented for her administrative service to the University community, including five UNM presidents, university athletics and the College of Education, where she has taught for 34 years.
- **Feroza Jussawalla** - Faculty Teaching Award presented for her commitment to teaching and research in the UNM English Department with a specialty in postcolonial literature.

Their stories are a legacy of the ways in which UNM Lobos are creating an impact on individual to global continuum.

### Expanding the Worlds of Others Through Language

It is always exciting to learn that a UNM program is considered one of the best nationally by higher education commissions and associations. In late-December, the UNM Signed Language Interpreting (SLI) program was informed that it was awarded accreditation to its [Bachelor of Science in Signed Language Interpreting](#) by the Commission on Collegiate Interpreter Education. This distinction stands out significantly because the program is now one of only 14 with that status. I had the opportunity to read the findings of the Commission and was impressed by all of the observed program strengths, including the exceptional administrative management from Program Director, Dr. Phyllis Wilcox; the critical integration and collaboration within the Department of Linguistics; and the significant stakeholder community involvement to support academia.

The report also stated that the UNM program might be unique in that one of our librarians, Kat Gullahorn, is fluent in American Sign Language, describing her as passionate about helping students “access the many learning resources the library has to offer.” I would like to express my gratitude to the entire Department of Linguistics, students, staff and faculty alike, for their efforts in attaining this recognition. This is an honor to the department, the College of Arts and Sciences and The University of New Mexico.
