Green Technology Award

The University of New Mexico and Sandia National Laboratories have received the [2015 Gold Award in Green Technology](#) from R&D magazine for development of the CO2 memzyme. CO2 memzyme is an ultra-thin membrane that is the first cost-effective technology for carbon dioxide separation and capture to meet and exceed the Department of Energy's (DOE) targets for helping to reduce the threat of climate change. Jeff Brinker, Ying-Bing Jiang and their collaborator from Sandia National Labs Susan B. Rempe, along with team members Yagin Fu, Dian Jiao, Juan Vanegas and Joseph Cecchi participated in the development of the technology. It was selected as one of the 100 most technologically significant new projects of the year in Mechanical/Materials for the R&D 100 awards.
