As a reminder, smoking and other tobacco use on UNM's campuses, including the use of e-cigarettes is <u>limited</u> to a small number of designated smoking areas; smoking area maps are available online for the <u>Albuquerque</u>, <u>Gallup</u> and <u>Valencia</u> campuses. In fall 2017, most of these designated areas will be eliminated as we continue our transition to a smoke-free and tobacco-free campus.
