Our "Virtual Launch," will be held Friday, May 7, from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. This will be a chance for up to 500 faculty, staff and students to work together in breakout sessions and respond to key questions about our future possibilities. <u>Registration to participate</u> is on a first-come, first-served basis.

From May 3 - 17, we'll schedule several other virtual interactive sessions for smaller groups of <u>students</u>, and from May 3 - 25 for <u>faculty and staff</u>. Your participation and candid opinions and ideas are encouraged and supported. As we progress, updates and reports will be made available on a dedicated website.

This will be a very inclusive process, and there will be several other ways to share your views before the final plan is finalized in February 2022.

This is an exciting time for UNM, as the Lobo community collectively creates a blueprint for our future – and a bright and successful future for UNM is my highest priority. Your voice is valued and needed as we define opportunity, together.
