Athletics Budget

As we approach our May 1 deadline for submitting the UNM budget to the NM Higher Education Department, I want to share some information regarding what we have to do to satisfy the requirements they have imposed. I realize there has been some heated debate on the subject of our athletics department budget over the years, but nonetheless, Lobo athletics is an important part of our culture and a part of the student experience.

At the recent budget summit, the Board of Regents charged me with proposing a solution to balance the FY19 athletics budget, while concurrently developing a detailed plan to reduce a multi-year deficit. Athletics Director Eddie Nuñez and I are in full agreement that addressing the concerns cited by both internal and external examinations is a priority, and balancing this budget will not be possible without making some tough decisions. We have been working with a team of talented financial professionals within the University to create both a plan to reduce the existing deficit and to craft a responsible budget for the future, which was presented at last week's Board of Regents Finance and Facility meeting. After receiving important feedback and providing additional information, we are prepared to present a realistic and responsible plan to the full Board tomorrow, that will allow athletics to balance its budget, be removed from enhanced fiscal watch, and build stronger relationships with our constituents across campus and within the state.

UNM Student Veteran Resource Conference

Our student veteran population offers a rich source of diversity and experience, which contributes to our intellectual community in many ways. I am excited to be a part of the <u>Sound-Off Conference</u> hosted by several of our student veteran organizations tomorrow, Tuesday, April 17.
