UNM has contracted with <u>Wheless Partners</u>, an executive search firm that will assist UNM with the search process for this critical leadership role. I am committed to a transparent process and ensuring opportunities for broad campus involvement. I will continue to update the campus community on significant milestones in the search process and the <u>executive search site</u> will be updated as the searches progress.
