Our Facilities Management Department will lower controlled building temperatures in areas not used during the break, through Jan 1. The effort is energy efficient and allows crews to do necessary upgrades to control systems while saving the University about \$18 million in utility costs. Right now, Facilities Management is looking at which areas will bring the most savings and will work with people whose offices are temperature sensitive, such as labs or other research environments.
