I realize there have been a number of questions that have arisen, about compensation in particular. Eric Putney named 2019 Goldwater Scholar

In the spirit of each of us defining all of us, the individual accomplishments of our students are the bright spots that define our success as an academic institution. Eric Putney, an undergraduate student in the Physics and Astronomy Department, was just <u>named a 2019-2020 Goldwater Scholar</u>. He was chosen for the award from among 5,000 college sophomores and juniors representing more than 400 schools. Only about 1,200 Goldwater Scholars are named each year, and it is one of the most significant awards presented to undergraduate students pursuing careers in mathematics, the natural sciences and engineering. Eric says he plans to pursue his Ph.D. in particle physics, with a goal to research antimatter and hopefully answer some of the many questions in his field. We look forward to seeing his future successes, and I personally wish him the best of luck in all his endeavors.

Professor Emeritus Enrique R. Lamadrid Recognized for Extraordinary Scholarly Contributions

One of our distinguished faculty, Enrique Lamadrid, was also recently recognized for his outstanding work. He won the 2019 North American Academy of the Spanish Language (ANLE) "Enrique Anderson Imbert" national prize. The prestigious award recognizes those who spearhead research, contributions, projects and publications supporting the knowledge of Spanish language, as well as Hispanic culture and literature. Professor Emeritus Lamadrid, part of the Department of Spanish and Portuguese, impressed the jury through his dedication to education and research.
