Last week, the sample – untouched for 50 years – was opened so our <u>researchers could start studying</u> it to learn more about lunar polar ice deposits. Their findings will impact humans' ability to travel in space and explore new horizons. In that same vein, today we have the opportunity to witness Mercury cross paths with the sun, weather permitting. The observatory is open for the public every Friday evening of the UNM semester, 7-9 p.m. MST and 8-10 p.m. during daylight savings hours.
