UNM Faculty Elected Fellows of the National Academy of Inventors

Our research story continues to be told through the outstanding accomplishments of our faculty, and it is amplified when innovation collides through collaboration. Bryce Chackerian and David Peabody, both professors in UNM's Department of Molecular Genetics & Microbiology, have recently been named 2019
Fellows of the National Academy of Inventors, having demonstrated "a highly prolific spirit of innovation in creating or facilitating outstanding inventions that have made a tangible impact on the quality of life, economic development and welfare of society." The work of Dr. Chackerian and Dr. Peabody is in developing a new vaccine technology that targets infectious diseases, chronic diseases and cancers; and together they co-founded AgilVax, a startup company that is licensing their VLP-based vaccine platform to develop antibody-based therapies to fight cancer. Their pioneering efforts are, indeed, deserving of this honor.
