This week, we're celebrating the graduation of our Fall 2020 class—a very special group, and perhaps one of the most unique graduating classes in the history of both our university and our nation. It's been a long year, with much of the world on pause during the COVID pandemic, and, as many of us can attest, creativity and motivation can be tough to muster.
