Good afternoon, Lobos--

While the summer months are relatively quiet at our Lobo athletic facilities, many of our student athletes are already training and preparing for their upcoming seasons. Lobo Athletics is a proud part of our shared UNM experience, with more than 400 student-athletes representing our university across 16 teams in the Mountain West Conference, and a dedicated group of coaches, trainers, administrators, and support staff working together to ensure our student-athletes have the support and resources they need to succeed.

Joining our crew of head coaches this year is **Darren Gauson**, who was recently selected by UNM Vice President/Director of Athletics Eddie Nuñez to serve as the <u>new head coach of our Lobo track and field and</u> <u>cross country team</u>s. Gauson comes to us from Bradley University in Illinois where he led his teams to 10 Missouri Valley Championships over the past eight years and was the Missouri Valley Coach of the Year 10 times. We are fortunate to have him leading our nationally recognized Lobo track and field and cross country teams, and I look forward to the coming season.

Although it's always a privilege to note the accomplishments of our Lobos on the field, I'm just as proud of their achievements in the classroom. Our <u>volleyball team recently earned its fourth straight USMC/American</u> <u>Volleyball Coaches Association Team Academic Award</u>, which honors volleyball teams that maintain a yearlong grade-point average of 3.3. The team also earned an Honor Roll distinction, one of only 45 schools in the nation, and one of two in the Mountain West, to earn such recognition.

Similarly, our softball team also had six players named Easton/National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-America Scholar-Athletes. **Maddie Boldt, Samantha Fohrman, Amber Linton, Grace Rana, Peyton Robinson, and Jenna Trim** were recognized for having a 3.50 or higher GPA for the 2022-2023 academic year. Meanwhile, the team ended the spring semester with a 3.48 GPA—their 26th straight semester with a 3.20 or better.

Schedules are being finalized for our fall sports, including <u>football</u>, <u>volleyball</u>, and <u>soccer</u>.
