Congratulations to Lobo track & field/cross country runner <u>Amelia Mazza-Downie</u>, who was just named the <u>2022-23 Mountain West Female Athlete of the Year!</u> The annual male and female athlete of the year awards, created by the Mountain West Conference in 2010, honor student-athletes who have demonstrated not only superb athletic achievement, but also strong academic success and exceptional character on and off the playing field.

Mazza-Downie's run as a Lobo has been one for the record books. As the winner of four All-American honors last season—in cross country, indoor track & field in the 5,000m, and outdoor track & field in both the 5,000m and 10,000m—her accomplishments are almost too many to count. In 2023 alone, she was named the Mountain West Female Outdoor Track & Field Athlete of the Year and won back-to-back Mountain West titles as she helped lead the Women's Cross Country team to its 15th straight title. Just as exciting, she earned first-team Academic All-American honors and recently graduated with a degree in psychology.

This is a fantastic way for Mazza-Downie to cap her remarkable career as a Lobo, and I know the entire Lobo community joins me in celebrating her achievements. Congratulations again, Amelia; you are an inspiration.

## UNMH to Provide Medical Services for MDC

## **Physics & Astronomy Receives NASA Grant for Exoplanet Research**

With the help of a grant from NASA, <u>Lobo researchers are looking to the stars not only for inspiration</u>, <u>but for confirmation of the presence of exoplanets</u>, which are planets that orbit around other stars. <u>The University of New Mexico's Department of Physics and Astronomy, under the leadership of assistant professor Diana Dragomir, has received a \$750,000 grant from NASA to support the ongoing work of confirming and measuring the periods of longer-period transiting exoplanets, with the help of TESS, the Transiting Exoplanet Survey Satellite, that can observe a wide expanse of sky. The hope is that learning more</u>

about planets outside our own solar system will help us understand more about our own planet's origins and journey through the universe, a noble cause entirely worthy of our Lobo research team.

## **Harwood Museum Celebrates Its Centennial**

One of our northern institutional gems turns 100 years old, as the Harwood Museum of Art of The University of New Mexico celebrates its centennial throughout 2023 and 2024. The Taos-based museum will commemorate its role as a steward of Western history and American art with Harwood 100, a series of exhibitions filling all nine of the museum's galleries, and will also host a regular series of community programs and activities. As part of the Harwood 100 Centennial programming, the museum will host a playwriting competition for the production of up to eight original 10-minute plays addressing the theme of Harwood 100: Reflecting on Our Legacy. Envisioning the Future. Aspiring playwrights aged 13 and up are encouraged to submit their plays for consideration by September 10, 2023.
