## **Minors on Campus Policy**

Summer is right around the corner. As you prepare for UNM camps and programs for children on the campus, please remember UNM's newly-enacted <u>UAP Policy 2205: Minors on Campus</u>. By instituting this policy in the spring of 2016, UNM placed emphasis and importance on safeguarding minors who interact with our faculty, staff, students, and volunteers. UAP Policy 2205 establishes general standards for minors participating in UNM programs and for minors visiting University workplaces and classrooms. This includes requirements for background checks for authorized adults, training, a participant waiver form, and an emergency contact and medical release form. Please refer to the policy and the attendant materials when planning UNM programs and activities in which <u>minors will participate</u>. In addition, there are two checklists to assist in planning a UNM Minors on Campus program that meets the requirements in UAP Policy 2205.
