NM Lottery Scholarship Receives A Boost

We received exciting news last Friday from the state Higher Education Department, which released the numbers for this year's <u>Lottery Scholarship funding</u>. UNM and other research sector institution students will receive more money for tuition than anticipated. Each student who is eligible for the Lottery Scholarship during the 2018-2019 school year will receive up to \$2,294 per semester. That's a significant increase from what we had anticipated, which is sure to help ease the financial burden of our students and their families.
