These tragedies shape our outlook, but we must not let them shake our resolve to unite as strong communities driven by mutual understanding, compassion and an unbending will to rise above hate and oppression. What we need to consider is that here at UNM, inclusion means that everyone is and feels valued - for who they are and what they aspire to; for their contributions and beliefs; and, even though we have our differences, for being a part of this singular community we call The University of New Mexico.

Our new Vice President for Equity and Inclusion, Assata Zerai, arrived on campus last week, and I look forward to the ways in which she will influence our campus and community conversations around inclusion. She has hit the ground running and will be working with the Division for Equity and Inclusion (DEI) office, as well as faculty, staff, students and the greater Albuquerque community, to strengthen existing projects and generate new initiatives. These efforts are aimed at continuing to make UNM more thoroughly inclusive of New Mexico's significant historic and dynamically changing population. I will work closely with Vice President Zerai as the University creates new strategies in the coming years to broaden our commitment to DEI and its goals.

UNM Contributes to Proactively Fighting Wildfires

Although we have received a lot of rain this summer, New Mexico is not always so green. The years with little rain also bring with them the increased risk of wildfires. Many of you may remember the Dog Head Fire in 2016 that consumed nearly 18,000 acres on the other side of Sandia Mountain. Our researchers here at UNM are now using economic analyses, natural science data and Earth observations to try to predict and prevent such devastating wildfires. Dr. Richard Bernknopf in the Economics Department is working with the United

States Geological Survey to create a fire vulnerability map to help better inform natural resource planning and fire suppression decisions. This is just one of the many research endeavors coming out of the University for New Mexico that will directly impact our state.
