## **International Education Week Celebrates Global Lobos**

This week, UNM celebrates global engagement by participating in the 19th annual International Education Week (IEW). The Global Education Office (GEO) is spearheading a local celebration here at UNM with opportunities to celebrate the benefits of international education and worldwide exchange. These events are important in developing mutual understanding and respect, building global leadership, and investing in future relations between the U.S. and people from around the world.

## **Seeking Outstanding Women in STEM**

ADVANCE at UNM has sought to increase the representation, diversity and advancement of women and minority faculty in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) disciplines. Through an anonymous gift made in 2015 to support the Women in STEM awards, this transformational program is now [looking for the next group of promising researchers for the 2020 awards](#). For first time, research assistants and associate faculty are eligible to submit proposals, and nominations are open earlier than usual this year in hope that more women will apply. Last year, [four scientists were given awards](#), which ranged from \$3,000 to \$15,000, and 31 women in a variety of STEM fields have received awards since 2016. Increasing and supporting the ranks of women in academic science and engineering careers is critical to the success of a diverse and excellent faculty, and I'm looking forward to learning about projects that will benefit from this award.

## **Women's Cross Country to Compete in NCAA Championships**

I want to congratulate our Women's Cross Country team and their coach, Joe Franklin, for securing their spot at the NCAA Championships for the 12th year in row after [finishing in second place at the NCAA Mountain Regional](#) last Friday. A special congratulations to Weini Kelati for defending her regional title by a margin of 57 seconds! The Division 1 NCAA Cross Country Championships take place this Saturday, Nov. 23, in Terre Haute, Ind.
