## Health Sciences Librarian Honored by Medical Library Association

Our libraries play a foundational role in enhancing the learning and research experience at UNM through scholarly resources, innovative and creative learning spaces, and outstanding service...all in a constantly changing landscape of technology and learning modalities. Last week, at the annual meeting of the Medical Library Association (MLA), Dr. Jonathan Eldredge, a professor at UNM's Heath Sciences Library and Informatics Center, received one of the MLA's highest awards when he was named a Fellow of the Medical Library Association. Dr. Eldredge was hailed for his career excellence, outstanding contributions to the profession, impactful scholarship, and leadership. Lindberg Research Fellowship, which Dr. Eldredge will use to support his work creating an open access textbook on evidence-based librarianship.

Congratulations to Ph.D. students Korey Tillman and Noelani Villa, who will continue their dissertation research in host countries, and to our three recent and new graduates--Solana Armijo, Arthur Lopez, and Jane Tabet-Kirkpatrick—who will serve as English Teaching Assistants in their host countries. Last fall, Fulbright received a record number of applications, making this one of the most competitive cycles in the 75-year history of the program, and I am delighted to see our students recognized with this prestigious award.

## **Lobo Volunteers Rendering Aid and Assistance**

As a leading part of New Mexico's health care system, UNM's health care workers regularly provide compassionate and cutting-edge health services for citizens across our state, and they often do it on their own time. That's certainly the case with Vanessa Garcia, a radiologic technician for the UNM Health Sciences Clinical & Translational Science Center, who was concerned about our fellow New Mexicans who have been recently displaced by the fires in the northern part of our state and launched Safe Space, a non-profit to help them find shelter. Safe Space works with a network of hotels in the region to provide discounted rates for the displaced, and also helps provide meals and other relief items. Vanessa's innovative solution reflects the spirit of service to our state and its citizens. Additionally, Byron Piatt, UNM's Emergency Manager, just returned from leading a month-long COVID-19 mission to support a hospital in American Samoa, providing critical medical care to our fellow global citizens while training care givers in providing an effective response. It has been a privilege to work with Byron as he has helped coordinate UNM's own emergency response to COVID-19 over the last two years; the team in America Samoa was fortunate to have his leadership and direction.
