ISS Reorganization Focuses on Responsiveness, Collaboration

UNM's Institutional Support Services (ISS) has recently made several strategic changes to enhance its operations and better serve the university community. These efforts include two departmental restructurings, leadership appointments, and the launch of a new department. UNM Capital & Space Strategies and UNM Planning, Design & Construction have been reorganized to create UNM Campus Capital & Space Planning (CCSP) and UNM Facilities Design & Construction (FDC), streamlining project workflows and strengthening collaboration. Additionally, ISS has formally launched the Office of Sustainability, which has already advanced several campus sustainability initiatives, including conducting UNM's first-ever waste audit at the Student Union Building and co-sponsoring a successful Sustainability Expo. I appreciate the hard work of the entire ISS team, under the leadership of VP Shawna Wolfe, to make ISS more collaborative, innovative, and responsive to the needs of our community.

Know Your Rights Under Title VI

I would like to remind our campus community about an important matter that affects us all. As you may know, last November the <u>U.S. Department of Education issued a "Dear Colleague" letter reaffirming our obligations under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964</u>. This federal law protects individuals from discrimination based on race, color, or national origin, including shared ancestry or ethnic characteristics, in programs or activities that receive federal funding.

Every student has the right to a learning environment that is free from discrimination. As your president, I want to emphasize our unwavering commitment to upholding these rights and fostering an inclusive environment where every member of our diverse community feels safe, respected, and valued.

We recognize that domestic and global events can heighten tensions on campus. Please know that we

are here for you. We take our responsibilities under Title VI very seriously and are dedicated to preventing discrimination in all its forms, promptly addressing any reported incidents, providing support to those affected by discrimination and educating our community about their rights and responsibilities. If you experience or witness any form of discrimination, I urge you to report it immediately through our established channels.

Our strength lies in our diversity, and together, we will continue to build a campus community that celebrates our differences and unites in our shared pursuit of knowledge and understanding. Thank you for your commitment to these important principles.
